### Missoula Children's Theatre: The Pirate Blackbeard

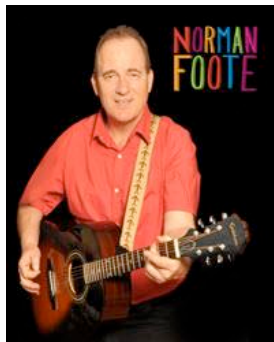
Saturday, September 20, 2014

At age 15, Teddy began his hoop dance training under the careful guidance of Scott Ward, a Metis Salteaux seasoned in the traditional art of the hoop dance. Beginning with 9 hoops, Teddy's love for the art grew into a passion, his ability rapidly increased until he was able to master the dance with as many as thirty hoops. In 2003, Scott Ward gave Teddy the permission to perform that all students must receive from their teachers before they can do so.

From 2001 to 2005 Teddy participated in a youth workshop, which increased his already considerable professional performance skills. He now regularly performs for audiences of more than 2000 students.

Teddy has honed his skills as a motivational and keynote speaker as well as a workshop facilitator. He has spoken to many audiences on issues including racism, bullying, violence, the importance of education, human rights, youth peace building and the experience of growing up in Rwanda.

Throughout Teddy's performances, workshops and motivational talks he draws on his experience of living and traveling around the world. Witnessing the diversity of cultures in the world has given Teddy a unique outlook on many issues that children face.
